XERMELO is a prescription pill, used along with somatostatin analog (SSA) therapy, for carcinoid syndrome diarrhea in adults who are not adequately controlled by SSA therapy.



What causes carcinoid syndrome diarrhea (CSD)?

CSD occurs when a neuroendocrine tumor (NET) cell produces too much serotonin.

Let's take a closer look

To better understand the cause of CSD, take a moment to learn about the science behind it.



When SSA injections alone are not enough, **ask your doctor if it's time for XERMELO**

Even though you are being treated with somatostatin analog (SSA) injections, you can still experience symptoms of CSD. **That's why your doctor may add XERMELO,** a prescription pill, to your treatment plan.

• The most common side effects of XERMELO include nausea, headache, increase in liver enzymes, depression, flatulence, decreased appetite, swelling of your hands and feet, fever, abdominal pain, and constipation.

Reduce your serotonin and manage CSD

XERMELO pills + somatostatin analog (SSA) injections work together to reduce excess serotonin and manage carcinoid syndrome diarrhea (CSD)

> SSA blocks release of serotonin outside the cell

XERMELO reduces overproduction of serotonin inside the cell

Unlike antidiarrheal medications, **XERMELO targets a key cause of CSD**, which is too much serotonin in the gut.

How XERMELO was studied

In the TELESTAR study, XERMELO + SSA was compared with SSA injections alone in 90 people (45 per test group) with CSD. Participants were having between 4 to 12 bowel movements (BMs) per day and were already on a steady SSA dose for at least 3 months. All participants were followed for 12 weeks and recorded diarrhea frequency in a daily diary.

XERMELO pills + SSA injections provide long-term relief for CSD

TELESTAR, the clinical study that led to the FDA approval of XERMELO, showed meaningful reductions in CSD symptoms.

XERMELO was studied in multiple long-term safety studies. The average treatment was 92 weeks. XERMELO + SSA reduced average daily BM frequency 2X more than SSA injections alone (-1.4 vs -0.6, respectively).



Give XERMELO 12 weeks to work

In the TELESTAR study, almost 9 out of 10 people with CSD (89%) taking XERMELO pills plus SSA injections had a reduction in diarrhea frequency at 12 weeks. In the same study, only 69% of patients on SSA injections alone reduced their BM frequency.

Most patients see **improvement in 12 weeks** and some patients may **start to see results as early as 1 to 3 weeks**.

XERMELO reduced serotonin levels

Carcinoid syndrome diarrhea (CSD) occurs when there is too much serotonin in the gut. When serotonin breaks down in your body, it becomes **5-hydroxyindoleacetic acid (5-HIAA). People with CSD often have high levels of 5-HIAA**. In the TELESTAR study, about 57% of patients that were enrolled had elevated 5-HIAA levels at baseline, while 27% had normal levels and ~15% had unknown levels at baseline.

At the end of the TELESTAR study, patients' 5-HIAA levels were measured. In the group treated with XERMELO + somatostatin analog (SSA) injections, 5-HIAA levels were **reduced by 40.1 mg**. In patients treated with SSA alone, 5-HIAA levels showed an **increase of 11.5 mg**.

Your doctor may measure your 5-HIAA to see how much serotonin is in your body.

XERMELO was shown to be **effective** in patients **regardless of their baseline 5-HIAA levels**.

XERMELO was well tolerated in most patients

Let your doctor know about any side effects you experience. The most common side effects of XERMELO combined with SSA therapy were nausea, headache, increase in liver enzymes, depression, flatulence, decreased appetite, swelling of hands and feet, and fever.

XERMELO may cause constipation which can be serious. You should stop taking XERMELO if severe constipation or severe, persistent, or worsening abdominal pain develops. Talk to your doctor if you have these symptoms.

In a 12-week clinical study, most patients who started on XERMELO stayed on XERMELO.

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How to get started with XERMELO

You need to take XERMELO 3 times a day, every day, with a meal or snack. That's because food increases your body's ability to absorb XERMELO.

- Excess serotonin is a key cause of CSD
- SSA injections may be less effective over time, causing CSD symptoms to return
- XERMELO pills + SSA injections can help reduce serotonin to help manage CSD
